What is the difference between these? The difference lies in the way these two films are presented. The location, setting and character of the characters do not make the viewer feel wrong. And that scene is not glorified there. But Mammootty in the film Kasaba (2016) wearing a police uniform and groping a woman in the same position with stylish background music and glorifying that scene is different. That is problematic. This is where we have to look at the political correctness in the movie. The impact of a scene on the audience should be taken into consideration. If it affects a society in a negative way, it is a mistake that must be corrected. Everyone celebrated the hugely successful movie Chanthupottu (2005) but no one remembered how much it hurt a certain section of the society. That movie spread a misconception and created a bad mindset among many people. The Chanthupottu movie was a mistake. But over the years, the film Njan Marykutty (2018) has changed that perception of the audience. Films are completely within the scope of freedom of expression of the writer and the director. The story emerges from their imagination or the light of life experience, dialogues are formed, plots are formed and it becomes a film. Because of that, the truth is that every movie has its own politics, some will be hidden and some will be openly expressed. Every movie has something to say to society and at least some people try to imitate it. The director has freedom of expression. But it is also necessary for an artist to have social responsibility. Because a work of art like a movie is one of the most influential things on people. Although the film does not convey a message, it is important not to convey the wrong message.
